Post-operative Care:

After surgery, all pets require a minimum of 7 to 10 days of restriction. More mature dogs and/or larger procedures may require further restriction. Your pet may also try to lick or paw at their incision site which can increase risk of infection and/or worst case tear stitches. Please follow all restrictions as outlined by the technician or assistant during your pet's surgical release.
